





More than just shopping!

Brigg not only has a great range of independent shopping and street markets available to you but there is so much more to discover here in the town.

If you are visiting with young children then FunForest should definitely be on your list of places to visit. The huge indoor play area is spread across four levels with dedicated areas for babies and toddlers and even an area for mums and dads to grab a drink whilst the children let off some steam.

Just over a mile away on the outskirts of the town is Brigg Garden Centre. This award winning garden centre has an amazing selection of plants on sale and everything you could dream of for the garden. Spend time browsing the home and giftware available for that special gift or just treat for yourself. Feeling hungry why not call into the Vineyard Café to refuel your batteries with something delicious to eat and drink? Be sure to visit Brigg Garden Centre at Christmas for an experience that can only be described as magical.

Along with the town's traditional markets on Thursdays you can also visit BSA Public Auctions (formally known as Stennet's) – an auction where you can find all sorts of things for sale from a second hand lawn mower to garden fresh vegetables. The auction always has a great atmosphere and you might even find some hidden gems.



If you are visiting during the winter months join the town's spooky Halloween ghost walk, an experience not to be missed. Hear tales of the town's ghouls and ghosts, including the story of the lady who haunts The Angel balcony and the soldiers who fought and died in the Civil War.

You can also learn lots about the history of the town by taking a walk around the historic streets. There are plenty of clues on the town's history, from the restored toll boards and water pumps to visiting Brigg Heritage Centre, which is based on the first floor of The Angel, a former coaching inn.

You can discover a Jacobean Manor House or enjoy a round of golf at Elsham Golf Club. Explore the Ancholme Valley or for the thrill seekers among you try Skydiving at Hibaldstow Airfield. There is something for everyone!



1 County Bridge & River Ancholme

The County Bridge dates from 1828 and crosses the river next to the Market Place.

2 Brigg Market Place


This is the setting for a Thursday market dating from 1204. There is a smaller market on a Saturday, and on the fourth Saturday of the month a Farmers' Market.

3 The Buttercross

Completed in 1817, this was once the town hall. The building now houses the Tourist Information Centre.

4 Brigg Heritage Centre

This beautifully restored former coaching inn is home to Brigg's Heritage Centre and the famous Bronze Age 'Brigg Raft'.



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5 Courts & Yards

Brigg's courts and yards contain a variety of specialist shops and link the town centre to the car park.

6 Toll Boards

Brigg's restored toll boards are a rare sight and serve as a reminder of the town's past.

7 St John's Church

This was a chapel of ease for St Mary's Church at nearby Wrawby until 1872.

8 Millennium Green

This small park, created for the Millennium, is a relaxing place on the banks of the Ancholme.

How to get here



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Getting here is easy...

North Lincolnshire is surprisingly easy to get to! Less than an hour's drive from the cities of Leeds, Sheffield, Lincoln, York and only 45 minutes from the P&O Ferries terminal in Hull.

By road

The M180 runs into the heart of the area, giving direct access to the national motorway network. It is an easy drive to North Lincolnshire from Hull (30 min) Lincoln (30 min), Leeds (1 hr), Doncaster (20 min), York (1 hr) and Sheffield (45 min).

By bus
