

WHITTON WALK

2.3 MILES

START The walk starts at the junction of Main Street and Church Hill. Park carefully on Main Street, Whitton, North Lincolnshire

THE WALK

1. Look for a gate on the opposite side of the road from the church and enter a side track initially crossing a pasture and then with wonderful views of the confluence of the Rivers Trent, Ouse and Humber.
2. Look for a path rising to the left of a bush with a waymarked sign and follow this path along the hillside with the main track sloping down on the right towards the river bank.
3. As you reach a wood the path slopes up to a kissing gate and finger post with a seat nearby to admire the view. Cross the stile and go straight ahead between fields.
4. At a finger post turn left onto a wide track.
5. Cross the road, following Ings Lane.
6. A finger post on your left indicates the way going sharply back left diagonally across the field to a stile.
7. Cross the stile aiming diagonally left again to a gateway with stiles and then turn left into a lane.
8. Look for a gateway on the right with a view of the church and go through, following a fence on the left which leads into an enclosed path.
9. The path emerges out of Post Office Lane at a telephone box. Turn right here walking down the road.
10. Where the road bends right go straight along a footpath to the right of the church.
11. At the road turn left up Church Hill and back to the start.

TERRAIN At point 2 the footpath is slanting and rises slightly to point 3, care should be taken here underfoot, thereafter the path descending slightly on good paths and tracks to Ings Lane. Two fields are crossed at points 6 & 7 with stiles on the way.

TIME Allow 1 to 1½ hrs at a leisurely pace and to take in the views.
