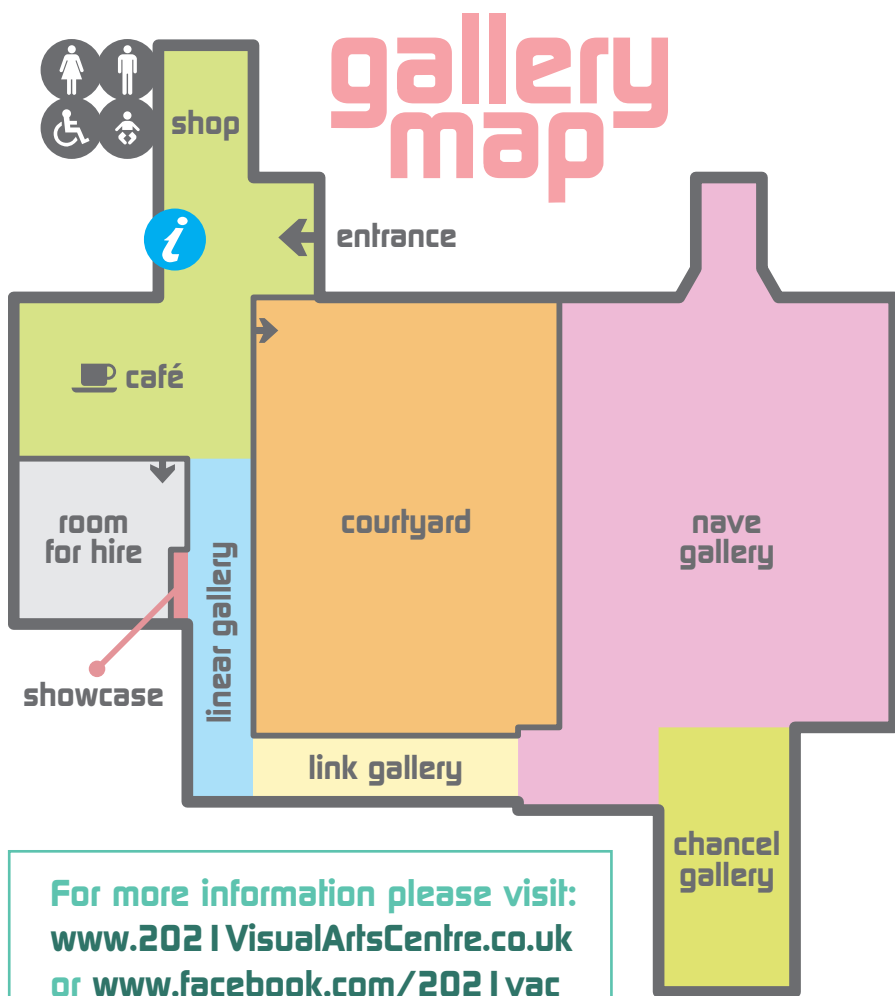

Speaking Tubes

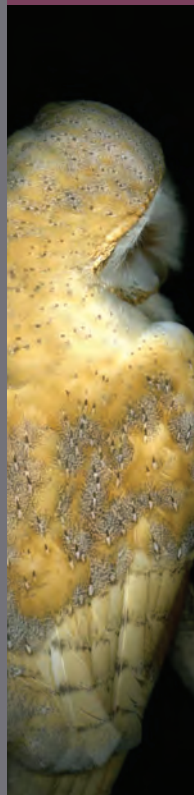
Innovative arts organisation IOU return to 20-21 to present Speaking Tubes and Vortex (see page 18). Speaking Tubes is a sculptural sound installation inspired by the extraordinary sound of vortex rings travelling through the atmosphere at supersonic speed. Made from gleaming galvanised steel, using large air-ducting tubes and giant cones, the sculpture spills out a chorus of sound into special listening zones.

A specially commissioned soundtrack has been created for Speaking Tubes by international contemporary music composer Yannis Kyriakides. Audiences can move around and explore the sculpture and enter the listening zones to make their own sound journey and become part of the sculpture.

Field Work

Liza Dracup

9 February to 11 May



From nocturnal woods to wildlife specimens, Liza Dracup is inspired by the landscape and natural history of Britain. Field Work presents a decade of her work, exploring photographic representations of our environment and cementing Dracup's standing as a pioneer of innovative approaches to landscape photography.

Dracup works with museum collections as well as directly with the natural world. She has a passion for selection and observation, and her work is imbued with the Victorian spirit of enquiry. Inspired by historic processes whilst embracing modern digital techniques, she uses photography as an experimental tool to see beyond the human eye. The resulting images range from vibrant 'hidden' landscapes to meticulously detailed studies of plants and animals.

Susan Simpson

Susan Simpson won our Open exhibition in 2018 with her enigmatic photographic self-portraits. As part of her prize she was offered a solo exhibition at 20-21 and Own Two Feet presents further work from which her Open-winning photographs were taken.

Susan works in multi-media, using simple materials such as felt, cardboard, paint and glue to make sculpture and installation. A trained commercial photographer, she combines the gloss of photographic images with hand-crafted objects. These child-like methodologies allow Susan a freedom of expression previously inhibited at a young age. In Own Two Feet she explores themes of gender, class and identity and how childhood experiences leave their legacy in our lives.

This will be an opportunity to come together, network and discuss how much of ourselves we put in the public domain through our art. Ian Kirkpatrick

We are delighted to present Mythomania, a new body of work by Canadian artist Ian Kirkpatrick. Ian uses graphic and packaging design software to produce large scale sculpture and 2D artwork using a variety of hard and soft materials such as perspex, vinyl, card and tarpaulin. Ian's work draws cultural connections between present-day global societies and ancient civilisations. It aims to show how myth is still a vital force in today's culture.

His monumental works combine the ancient and modern, referencing totems and industrial signage. He explores mythic narratives from Greek legends to modern superheroes. The exhibition spans two galleries, the Linear and the Link. Ian is creating a site-specific piece to stand in the café area so customers will be able to view his work while sitting and relaxing here.

Johnny White's 'Beastly Machines' exhibition of mechanical, kinetic sculptures shown here in 2011 was one of our most popular exhibitions. Following its showing here, the exhibition toured to 16 museums and galleries around the UK and was seen by over 179,000 people.

In summer 2019 White returns, this time collaborating with partner Amanda Wray, to produce 'Human Machines', a new series of interactive installations addressing the theme of the human condition.

Combining sculpture, traditional engineering and metalsmithing techniques and contemporary electro mechanics, the work will reflect pivotal moments in life, as well as common experiences and feelings and will highlight our similarities as humans rather than emphasising our differences.

Expect ingenious mechanical wonders, amusing observations, and interactive fun for all the family.

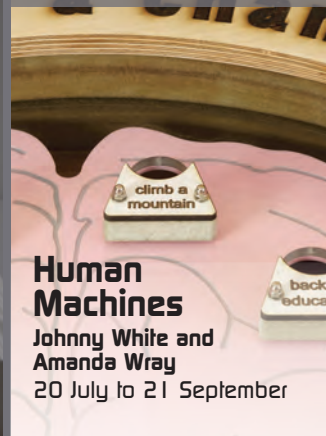

International LEGO® Brick Art

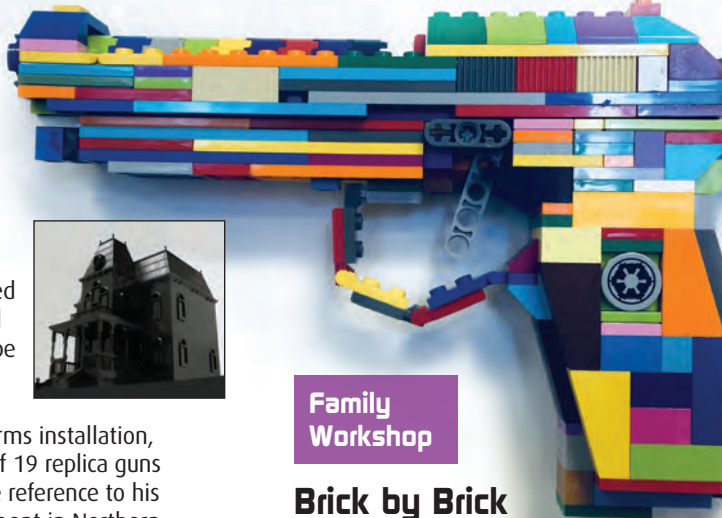

Brick by Brick is an exhibition of work by international artists, designers and photographers who use LEGO® bricks as their medium or inspiration. The show will include a range of two and three dimensional work in a variety of scales, and aims to showcase the wide range of creative approaches that artists take when using this world-famous construction brick.

Ekow Nimako, based in Toronto, Canada, will be exhibiting five works from his Building Black: Mythos series, which reference afrofuturism, mythology and the metaphor of West African proverbs. Award winning artist Michael Brennand-Wood will be creating an abstract piece entitled 'Return to the Lost City of LEGO®' and Italian artist Luigi Franchi will be showing a selection of his photographs which he cleverly modifies with LEGO® bricks.

Belfast based artist, David Turner will be exhibiting a poignant LEGO® firearms installation, consisting of 19 replica guns which make reference to his childhood spent in Northern Ireland during 'The Troubles'. 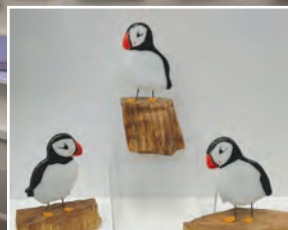

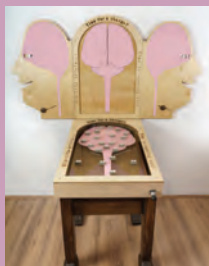
