## North Lincolnshire Museum <sup>10</sup>

A visit to the Museum is a step back in time through fascinating hands-on displays. Explore the geology, local history and archaeology galleries. Plus a programme of changing family friendly exhibitions and events for all ages. Families can visit Dudley's Den, our Under 5s space. No visit is complete without a browse in the gift shop. The Museum is open Monday to Saturday 10am til 4pm and Sundays 1pm til 4pm. Admission is free.



## The Baths Hall <sup>3</sup>

Located in the heart of Scunthorpe, the venue hosts a multi-genre programme of the very best touring comedy, music and entertainment, as well as a hugely popular annual pantomime.

A flexible space, the main auditorium can cater for up to 1,000 people seated, or 1,800 with a mixture of seating and standing, and our bars and ancillary spaces play host to smaller live performances, as well as our workshop and community programme of dance, drama and music.



## The Plowright Theatre <sup>2</sup>

Originally known as Scunthorpe Civic Theatre, the Plowright Theatre was built in 1958. A traditional proscenium-style theatre with a 330 seat auditorium, it was re-named in the 1990s in recognition of the achievements of local actress Joan Plowright.

The theatre stages a mix of professional music, drama and comedy; alongside productions by the many amateur societies who make the venue their home. A number of hugely famous acts have performed at the theatre over the years, including comedian Lee Evans who, as part of the theatre's 50th anniversary in 2008, performed a low-key warm-up show for his arena tour.
